SING "I Can Sing a Rainbow" with your child.

SORT toys, clothes, or craft materials by color. (For younger children begin with only one or two colors.)

PLAY Color Tag with your child. Call out a color and then have them run and touch something that color. Take turns with your child on naming the color and finding the object.

PROVIDE finger paint on a cookie sheet for your child to explore mixing colors. Or, use shaving cream with drops of food coloring.

Books About Colors

GIVE your child two toilet paper tubes to decorate with their favorite color marker. Tape the tubes together to make "binoculars." Have your child use the binoculars to spot items of their favorite color.

PLAY "I Spy" with your child.

DANCE with ribbons, paper streamers, or scarves in several colors. As the music plays, ask questions or give directions about the color of the object your child is waving.

CREATE a single color sensory bin for your child. As you focus on teaching your child a specific color, load a sensory bin with multiple objects of the same color.

MAKE a Color Hop game. Draw circles on the sidewalk with chalk or tape colored paper to the floor. Gather matching crayons for each colored space. Choose a crayon and have your child hop on that color.

GUIDE your child to make a color collage. Provide colored paper and craft materials, such as pom poms, feathers, and stickers in the same color. Have your child glue the objects to the paper.
